



Public Realm and Interchange Improvements Around Maryland Station

Newham Council has secured over £3m from Transport for London (TfL) to significantly improve the footways, public space and road layout around Maryland Station, for the arrival of the Elizabeth Line to Newham.

We held an extensive public consultation on our proposals in April 2016. The feedback from local residents and businesses has helped us finalise our plans.

Works Starting Soon

We will start works in April 2019 and we aim to complete the majority of works by the end of this year, in time for the opening of the Elizabeth Line.

What's Changing?

Key changes include:

- Replacing the roundabout with a new signalised 'T' junction to improve traffic flow
- New controlled crossings to make it safer for pedestrians and cyclists
- Much wider footways, in particular at the station entrance to create a safe and welcoming arrival to Maryland
- New public spaces with trees, seating and cycle parking
- The "Twisty Clock" will be slightly repositioned and the clock face improved
- Introducing a 20mph speed limit and traffic calming measures
- Better bus stops, parking, loading and taxi rank facilities
- New white lighting and CCTV to deter anti-social behaviour

We are currently doing some minor works along Leytonstone Road, near Tesco. These are not part of our improvements works around Maryland Station.

Construction Liaison Officer
